# Ation's Reading Report Card 2013 State Snapshot Report

# Rhode Island Grade 8 Public Schools

#### **Overall Results**

- In 2013, the average score of eighth-grade students in Rhode Island was 267. This was not significantly different from the average score of 266 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Rhode Island in 2013 (267) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (265) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (264).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Rhode Island (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 45 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (44 points).
- The percentage of students in Rhode Island who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 36 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (33 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Rhode Island who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 77 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (76 percent) and in 1998 (76 percent).





## Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 25 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (22 points).
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 26 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (29 points).
- In 2013, female students in Rhode Island had an average score that was higher than male students by 11 points.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 26 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (26 points).
