
What is the Concurrent Enrollment Program at URI?

The Concurrent Enrollment Program at the University of Rhode Island offers students in high schools the chance to study college level courses and receive college credit for their efforts. Students benefit by the opportunity to address the challenges of college level curricula with their high school teachers in a familiar environment at fees substantially lower than on-campus courses.

Eligibility

Concurrent enrollment is designed for motivated students, typically juniors and seniors, who seek to get a head start on college credit and who are looking to be challenged academically while in high school. URI in partnership with your HS is already sponsoring a course at your school. To be eligible for enrollment in this URI/HS class, students should have a 3.0 minimum high school GPA or for an exception, the student must have the recommendation of the school counselor and/or school administrator and/or teacher.

How Do I register for my HS course?

In order to register for your URI/HS class you first need to complete our online non-matriculating student form. [Non-Matric form.](#)

You need to complete this form for **each term** (Fall and Spring) you enroll in a URI/HS class. For Fall enrollment, you must complete the **registration** process **NO LATER THAN by Tuesday, September 20, 2016**. Please be advised that it can take up to 10 business days to process your non-matric form. We strongly recommend that you complete and submit this form no later than by September 8, 2016.

Once your URI ID number has been confirmed via email you need to first activate your account in eCampus and then complete the registration process by adding the class through your eCampus account. Your HS teacher will give you the URI class number and assign you a permission number to add the class to your account.

Upon course completion, a grade is recorded on your official URI transcript and your high school transcript. If you decide that you want to withdraw your enrollment from a URI class, you must do so before Wednesday, September 28, 2016 otherwise a "W" will be recorded on your official URI transcript.

Credits will carry over when you enroll at URI, or they may transfer to one of the many colleges or universities that accept URI credits. More information regarding course transfers among the public higher education institutions can be found at ritransfers.org.

What is the Cost?

- The concurrent enrollment course cost is \$195 for a 3 credit course and \$260 for a 4 credit course.
- Governor Raimondo's Prepare RI Dual Enrollment Fund will provide funding for every qualifying public school student to take a HS college course as part of their HS requirements

at no cost to the student or family. This fund does not cover the cost for any summer course enrollments and the cost of textbooks or other course materials.
