



## Support Professional Requirements for Expert Residency Preliminary Certificates (1<sup>st</sup> Issuance)

An Expert Residency Preliminary Certificate is renewable annually. The applicant must satisfy all of the applicable requirements outlined in the table below. Some certificate areas require coursework while others require both coursework and a valid RI certificate. All certificate areas require the applicant to take and pass RI assessments (through the ETS testing service at ([www.ets.org](http://www.ets.org)) as well as hold a Bachelor’s degree from a regionally accredited institution.
