

Graduation Rate

Rhode Island uses the "cohort formula" to determine graduation rates. The formula calculates, for each cohort of entering freshmen, the percentage of students who graduated in four years or fewer, taking into account those students that transferred in or out. In the first field, the lower portion of the bars shows the percentage of each freshman cohort that dropped out, received GEDs, or was still in school after four years. Those who were still in school may graduate at a later date.

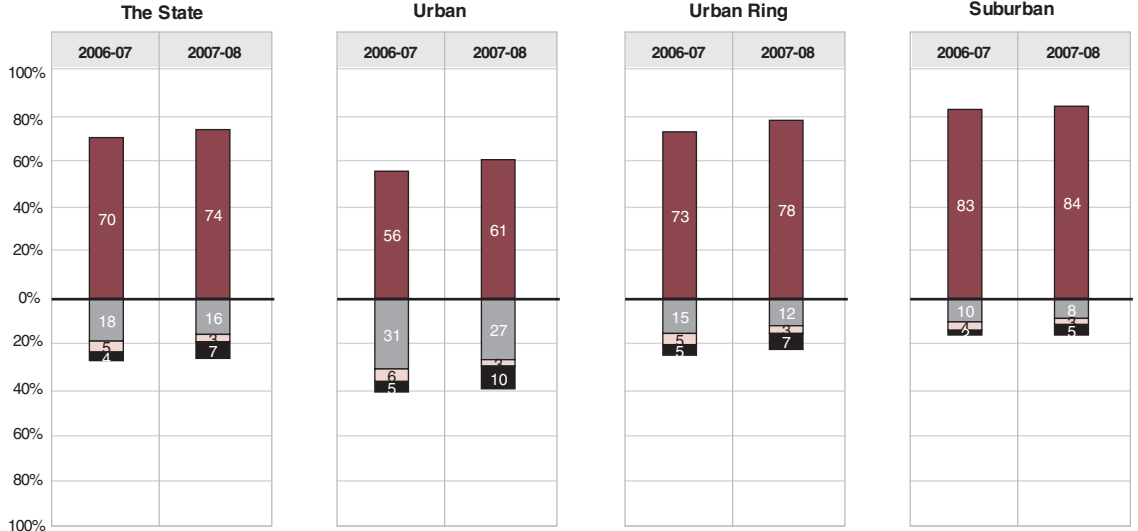
Urban = Central Falls, Pawtucket, Providence, Woonsocket

Urban Ring = East Providence, Cranston, Johnston, Newport, North Providence, Warwick, West Warwick
