What is the All Course Network (ACN)?

The ACN is part of PrepareRI, a statewide initiative to build career pathways for all Rhode Island youth. It is designed to help districts and schools offer their students a wide range of academic and enrichment opportunities outside of the traditional school day - **at no cost to students and families.**

What grades and districts are eligible to enroll in ACN courses?

RIDE recently received a federal grant and expanded seats available on the ACN and **now includes all RI students enrolled in Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 12.**

All RI districts participate in the ACN. To discuss the ACN with someone at your school, contact school counselors (middle and high school students) or school principals (elementary school students).

Why is the ACN an important resource for RI students?

Supplemental coursework through the ACN helps students get a head start on college and careers, develop social and emotional skills, explore interests, master the skills required of a lifelong learner, and have fun with other students. The ACN is for all RI students and no matter your goals, there is something for everyone on the ACN!

What types of courses are offered on the ACN?

Courses are offered fully online, online and in person (hybrid) or fully in person*. The ACN offers five course types:

- **Work-Based Learning** - These courses assist students in accomplishing deep learning in a chosen area of interest and allow students to explore future career pathways, for high school credit.
- **Advanced Placement (AP)** - AP courses are developed and approved by the College Board and offer students the opportunity to earn college credit through an end of course exam.
- **Dual Enrollment** - These courses are offered by colleges to allow students to explore college level coursework and college communities to determine their interest in possible postsecondary education paths. College and high school credit is offered for these courses.
- **Career Credential** - These courses assist students in accomplishing deep learning in a chosen area of interest and prepare them for employment or further education in a career path, while earning an industry-recognized credential and high school credit.
- **Enrichment** - Enrichment courses are designed to give students the opportunity to try new things and explore and develop interests outside of the classroom. Credits are not earned for these courses.

How many courses can I/my student enroll in?

- The number of courses you/your student can enroll in varies by semester and course type. See below.
 - Students may take 2 **credit bearing** courses per semester in Fall and Spring. Yearlong courses count as 1 **credit-bearing** course for each semester.
 - Summer 2022: 1 credit-bearing course and up to 4 additional enrichment courses.
 - Pre-registration limit = 8 courses

*All in-person class meetings will comply with CDC and RIDOH requirements during COVID.



- o Fall 2022: Up to two credit-bearing courses. Yearlong courses count as one course in the fall and one course in the spring.
 - Pre-registration limit = 6 courses
- o Spring 2023: Up to two credit-bearing courses. Yearlong courses count as one course in the fall and one course in the spring.
 - Pre-registration limit = 6 courses

How To Pre-Register for the All Course Network (Fall 2022, Spring 2023, AND 22-23 Yearlong courses)

 - o Parents of rising K-8 students should create an account and pre-register their students. Students in grades 9-12 should create their own account.

What is the 2022-2023 ACN timeline?

Summer 2022:

- Tuesday, June 7th: Students and families are notified via e-mail of summer course lottery results and course seat offers.
- Tuesday, June 7th (evening) -Tuesday, June 14th at 11:59pm: Acceptance window for students and families to log into their EnrollRI dashboards and accept summer course seats.
- Wednesday, June 15- Monday, June 20: System shutdown for end of year process; ALL account access will be disabled during this time
- Tuesday, June 21: Any courses not filled through the lottery will re-open for open enrollment through the first week of courses and will fill through a waitlist process.
- Tuesday, July 5-August 19: Summer 2022 semester; all summer courses fall within the July 5-August 19 timeframe and have varied start/end dates.

Fall 2022

- Monday, July 18: Fall, Spring, and Yearlong course pre-registration reopens for students and families.
- Monday, August 15 at 9pm: DUAL ENROLLMENT pre-registration closes in EnrollRI.
- Tuesday, August 16 by 12pm: DUAL ENROLLMENT school member course approvals
- Wednesday, August 17: Fall course lottery for DUAL ENROLLMENT courses
- Wednesday, August 17 (evening)-Wednesday, August 24 at 11:59pm: Acceptance window for students to log into their EnrollRI dashboards and accept Fall semester DUAL ENROLLMENT course seats. Students are notified via email and phone calls.
- Tuesday, August 30 at 5pm: Pre-registration closes for all remaining course types for Fall & Yearlong course lottery (Advanced Placement, Career Credential, Enrichment, and Work-based Learning)
- Thursday, September 1: Fall & Yearlong Course Lottery runs
- Thursday, September 1 (evening)-Wednesday, September 7 at 11:59pm: Acceptance window for students and families to log into their EnrollRI dashboards and accept fall/yearlong seats.
- Thursday, September 8: Fall 2022/Year-Long 22-23 Open Enrollment begins; students & families can register for courses with open seats. Courses will fill through a waitlist process.

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Spring 2023

- Thursday, September 8-Friday, December 9 at 5pm: Pre-registration for Spring 2023 courses available.
- Monday, September 12: Fall & Yearlong courses begin with varied start dates.
- September 12 - December 16: Fall & Yearlong semester with varied start/end dates.

- Friday, December 9 at 5pm: Pre-registration closes for Spring 2023 course lottery
- Tuesday, December 13: Spring 2023 course lotteries run
- Tuesday, December 13 (evening)-Tuesday, January 3 at 11:59pm: Acceptance window for students and families to log into their EnrollRI dashboards and accept spring seats.
- January 9 - May 26: Spring semester with varied start/end dates.

I just pre-registered myself or my student for a course with open spaces. What happens next?

- All credit-bearing courses for grades 6-12 will await approval by a school counselor or designee. If approved, all semester pre-registrations are “pending-awaiting lottery” until the lottery takes place.
- All semester pre-registration for non-credit bearing courses for grades K-12 are “pending-awaiting lottery” until the lottery takes place.
 - Once the lottery takes place, every pre-registration will be offered a seat OR be assigned a course waitlist. Log into your EnrollRI account and from the “Student Dashboard” you will “accept” or “decline” any seats offered. The offers will expire one week of the lottery results being announced.
 - All course pre-registrations that do not result in enrollment will expire at this time.

My course choice has a “waitlisted” status. What does this mean?

- **Waitlisted status does not mean you are enrolled in the course.** You or your student applied for a course that has more demand than seats available.
- Once the seat acceptance window closes and students make course selections, you may see your waitlist position shift.
- If a seat becomes available in the course, and you have not exceeded your (2) credit bearing course maximum, you or your student will receive an email notification that action is required on your EnrollRI dashboard.
- Please log in and accept or decline the seat offer. If declined, the seat offer will move to the next student on the waitlist.
- If you have not exceeded the 2-course maximum, you will be auto-enrolled in the course. Please check your EnrollRI dashboard for the most up-to-date enrollment information.

My student’s pre-registration has not been approved, what do I do?

- Reach out to your school to determine if the pre-registration was denied or your school point of contact has not had a chance to review. School points of contact can provide additional details if a pre-registration was denied.



What is the ACN Lottery process?

- All ACN courses will have an enrollment lottery. In order to participate in the lottery for any courses you or your student are interested in, make sure to pre-register before the semester's pre-registration deadline. You will be notified of the courses you have been approved for and will need to confirm your final choices.
- Courses with availability after the initial pre-registration lottery period will re-open for enrollment.

Why is ACN shifting to a lottery process?

- RIDE recognizes that a first-come, first-serve policy isn't always equitable. All courses for the 2022-23 school year will enroll by lottery to increase access, particularly for our most vulnerable students who may not have access to as many course offerings as their peers.

What will change for courses now that ACN will have a semester lottery for every course?

- Once the pre-registration window closes, no pre-registrations will be accepted so the course lotteries can be run. Once the course lotteries are run, students will have time to log back in and accept their seats. For those who do not get a seat, they will be assigned a waitlist number. Open courses will be available for additional registrations during open enrollment, barring any technical issues related to lottery and course selection processes, but students who choose to pre-register after the lottery will go to the bottom of the waitlist. The Fall/Yearlong course lottery will run in late August, and the Spring 2023 course lottery will run in December 2022.
