### **3. DISCUSSION ITEMS**

#### **Higher Education Governance Structure**

Chair Mancuso welcomed Aims McGuiness of the National Center for Higher Education Management Systems and turned the meeting over to him at this time.

Mr. McGuiness shared with the Board a short history on his personal and professional background, and explained that he would next introduce a draft governance structure for the Board's review. He invited Board members to feel free to ask questions as they may arise.

The draft governance structure suggests the Board of Education be split into two groups, a Pre k-12 Council and a Council for Post-Secondary Education. Both of these councils would be given full statutory authority for governance and regulation. There would also be an Executive Committee that would be responsible for reviewing proposals to the Board and addressing future needs.

As the Board of Education, these two councils and its Chair, will meet regularly to establish long-range goals, prioritize its workforce, promote collaboration and establish strategic budget and finance recommendations. The full Board would also be responsible for leadership on cross-cutting issues such as college and career readiness, implementation of the common core and adult education.

A discussion on this issue between Mr. McGuiness and the Board followed. Mr. McGuiness answered Board members questions on multiple topics including:

- The structure and role of the Executive Committee
- The time frame and legislative approval
- Cross-cutting issues
- What authority would be given to the Councils
