

# CURRICULUM MATTERS FOR OUR CIT D S

### RIDE has defined curriculum as:

- A standards-based sequence of planned experiences where students practice and achieve proficiency in content and applied learning skills.
- What is essential for teaching and learning so that every student has access to rigorous academic experiences.
- The necessary goals, methods, materials and assessments to effectively support instruction and learning.

## **ADOPTION**

ALL students have equitable access to strong, effective core instruction using high-quality curriculum and differentiated instructional practices.

### RI Legislation requires:

- LEAs to select identified high-quality curriculum materials (HQCM) no later than June 20, 2023 in ELA and math, and science in 2025.
- RIDE releases a list of high-quality ELA & math curricula in June 2020.
- Curriculum materials that are responsive to the LEA's cultural and linguistic needs, and support culturally responsive & sustaining education.

# **IMPLEMENTATION**

- High-quality curriculum materials support educators in their work as teachers spend less time creating and searching for materials.
- Teachers have more time for:
  - deepening their pedagogical content knowledge.
  - Universal Design, scaffolding up from core content, and getting to know their students.

A curriculum launch and implementation plan is key to sustainable student achievement.



# **SUPPORT**

Ongoing professional learning and support is critical.



- RIDE created the Educator Course Network (ECN) which provides professional learning experiences aligned with HQCM.
- RIDE offers support with national experts for professional learning.
- LEAs complete an in-depth review of selected curriculum materials to ensure they meet their students' needs and legislation requirements.
- LEA cohorts supported by EdReports and RIDE staff in the adoption and implementation phases.
- LEAs plan for ongoing professional learning to support this work through their Professional Learning Plan.

# **SUCCESS**

In order to succeed in ensuring that ALL students are learning from HQCM, we need to celebrate, collaborate, and learn with one another.

- Since 2018, 30 LEAs in RI adopted HQCM in ELA and/or mathematics. LEA teams of educators and administrators participated in HQCM selection cohorts as a collaborative professional learning opportunity with RIDE and EdReports.
- Schools-in-Action visits highlighted schools who have adopted and implemented HQCM so schools and districts can learn from and with one another.
